OBJECTIVES

- World Water Day is an international observance day. The intention is to inspire people around the world to learn more about water-related issues and to take action to make a difference.
- Relevant issues include water scarcity, water pollution, inadequate water supply, lack of sanitation, and the impacts of climate change (which is set to be the theme of World Water Day 2020). The day brings to light the inequality of access to WASH services and the need to assure the human right to water and sanitation.
- The focus on universal access to clean water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) is in line with the targets of Sustainable Development Goal 6. The UN World Water Development Report (WWDR) is released each year around World Water Day.

WAYS TO CONSERVE WATER



Get an Energy Star Labelled Washing Machine. Wash only full loads.

Put a faucet aertors on sink faucets.



Install new toilets less than 1.6 gallons per flush.

Use plants that require less water



Turn off the water while soaping hands and brushing teeth.



Take shorter showers - five minutes or less is best.



Water your yard and outdoor plants early or late in the day to reduce evaporation.

Use a shut off nozzle on your hose.



Turn off sink faucet while scrubbing dishes and pots.

Use a broom, not a hose, to clean driveways and walkways.



- Rainwater harvesting is used by many people and it could prove to be beneficial to you, too. Consider it!
- Use only one drinking glass for your water for the day.
- Check your hoses and pipes for leaks, cracks and other damage.
- Try to use fewer plates and cups to reduce the amount of water that needs to be used.

- Fill the sink with soapy water in the sink when washing dishes by hand. Quickly rinse under a slow-moving stream from the faucet.
- Teach your kids to turn the faucets off tightly after each use.
- Don't over-water your lawns and faster than the soil can absorb.
