Following the tribute, a Memorial Lecture was delivered by Thiru. S. Sendil Vinod, Former Principal / Assistant Professor in Biology, Co-operative College of Education, Puducherry on 'Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose: The Man Who Listened to Nature'. The lecture highlighted Bose's pioneering discoveries in plant physiology, explaining how he used his own invention, the crescograph, to measure plant responses to various stimuli and demonstrate the parallelism between animal and plant tissues. The resource person also emphasized that Bose founded the Bose Institute, a premier and one of the oldest research institutes in India. Established in 1917, it holds the distinction of being the first interdisciplinary research centre in Asia.



A total of 91 students from Raddha English Higher Secondary School, Ariyankuppam, Puducherry, participated in and benefitted from the programme.
